Plan, Prepare, and Present (Yourself) Answer Questions Finish and Follow Up





Plan: Do Your Research

Organization, Industry, and People who work there

- News Media and Trade Press
- Social: LinkedIn, Glassdoor.com, etc.
- O*Net www.onetonline.org
- Professional Contacts

What are the motivators and pain points?







Plan: Assemble Information About You

Create list of when and how you:

- Used skills and experience employer is seeking
- Went above and beyond to achieve goal
- Led successful team
- Accomplished something others could not
- And more...







Prepare: Responses to Common Questions

- Anticipate interview questions
 - Tell me about yourself
 - Strengths and Weaknesses
 - Why did you leave your last job?
 - Salary
- Prepare responses (in writing)

For inspiration, use Generative AI (Chat GPT and others) or search the Internet for possible questions.






Prepare: Stories Are Powerful!

Stories are remembered up to 22 times more than facts alone!


Create stories about:

- Accomplishments and Success Stories
- Strengths and Weaknesses
- Led Team, Increased Sales, Improved Productivity
- And more









Present (Yourself)

 Be Active & Engaged
Avoid "Old Fashioned" words & phrases - I HATE Zoom!
Carbon Copy
Rolodex
Yellow Pages
Back in the day...







Respond to Questions

- Listen carefully
- Consider "intent" of question -- respond to intent
 - Do you have children?
 - Are you married?
 - Why do you want to work here?
- Tailor responses to job
 - Where do you want to be in 5,10, 15 years?
 - Why do you want to work here?





"No, but..."

If you do not quite have what they are looking for, but...

- >> You will have it soon
- >> You have *some*, but not all
- You have done something similar that prepared you





Tell me about yourself

You will NEED a response to this question!

- Create (and practice!) short response, including
 - How you got into the field
 - Experience, skills, training, certifications, etc.
 - *Relevant* accomplishments
 - Finish by connecting to job you are interviewing for
 - Depending on situation 30 seconds to two minutes





Tell me about yourself

"I've been an account manager for over a decade. I've primarily been working with tech companies to build strong client relationships and deliver tailored service solutions. My experience includes navigating complex contract negotiations and consistently achieving above-target retention rates.

At my current job, I've led our team to a 20% increase in client retention by implementing strategic communication plans and personalized account reviews. I also spearheaded our quarterly client feedback sessions, which were crucial in adapting our services to better meet client needs.

I'm good at building relationships, and I love making sure client satisfaction rates stay high. So, when I saw your ad, I wanted to apply immediately. I'm really impressed by your company's commitment to innovation.

I'm pretty excited about the opportunity to put my strategic thinking to good use and use my client management skills to help your team."

Strengths & Weaknesses

- 🕨 Think Ahead
- Prepare Stories
- Discuss "takeaways" and what you learned
- Use STAR approach
 - Situation
 - Task
 - Action
 - Result





STAR Approach

Talk about each part

- Situation what happened or context
- Task what you needed to do or challenge
- Action what you did
- Results What was the outcome or result

Mention lessons learned or key takeaways





Why did you leave your last job?

Easy answers:

You got a better job, laid off, company downsized, went to school or training.

If departure was difficult:

- Prepare a brief response and practice until you can say it without flinching.
- Do not say anything negative about organization or boss.





Salary

If you don't negotiate, you may be leaving \$\$\$\$ on the table.

- Research: Salary.com, Monster.com. LinkedIn, Salary expert.com, and more
- Decide salary and benefits you want
- Try to delay salary discussion

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- Ask about salary ranges or bands
- Consider non-financial compensation
 - Schedule and Paid Time Off
 - Hybrid or Remote work
 - Early performance review

- Check in with interviewer Is there anything else you would like to know?
- Plan for follow up
